## GOD BLESS AMERICA!

America the Beautiful. Land of The Free and Home of The Brave. Baseball and Apple Pie. Hot Dogs and Hamburgers at the Park. Fireworks. The Star Spangled Banner. The Pledge of Allegiance. All of these muster a feeling in the hearts of Americans from Coast to Coast. A feeling of profound blessing to live in the Greatest Country in the history of the world.



America was founded by regular people, with a faith in The God of the Bible, who wanted to escape religious persecution and the rule of a monarch who didn't care about the welfare of his subjects, but only about himself and his own opulent lifestyle, built on the backs of the hardworking masses.

People from England, who were told how to worship and not worship, who were persecuted and stripped of their rights as humans, ordained by God, had two choices; stay and continue to live a hopeless life under the thumb of an evil King or set sail to a New World. Untamed and unsettled. A place with overwhelming risk of survival, but a place where they could establish a society centered on the love of God Almighty, and a place where they could live by His rules, and not those of a selfish and prideful King.

They wanted to rule themselves as equals and just as the Israelites of the Old Testament did when they escaped from Pharaoh in Egypt, they trusted in God to protect them and see them through in a wild and unforgiving land.

The first settlers arrived in Jamestown in 1607, which is now Virginia, and later in Plymouth in 1620 and



the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1630. They all suffered unbelievable hardship and many made the ultimate sacrifice to settle the land that would one day become America. They made peace with the Native Americans for the most part (although some were hostile) who were already here. They traded with them and learned how to farm and flourish with the aid of their new neighbors.

The Pilgrims of Plymouth established a framework of what would become the basis of our Constitution some 150 years

later, called the Mayflower Compact, a set of rules for self-governance in their new home. When the Pilgrims set out on the ship for America in 1620, they intended to lay anchor in northern Virginia. But after treacherous shoals and storms drove their ship off course, they landed in Massachusetts instead, near Cape Cod, outside of Virginia's jurisdiction. Knowing life without laws could prove catastrophic, colonist leaders created the Mayflower Compact to ensure a functioning social structure would prevail.

The Mayflower had 102 passengers aboard, 50 men, 19 women and 33 young adults. Only 41 were Pilgrims, seeking freedom from the Church of England and the rest were common folk; merchants, craftsmen, indentured servants and orphans whom the Pilgrims called "strangers".

Their journey was financed under contract by investors who expected to be repaid with a profit when they landed in Virginia. When they landed in Massachusetts instead, the strangers considered the contract void, since they didn't land in the King's sanctioned colony. The defiant strangers refused to recognize any rules since there was no official government over them. Pilgrim leader William Bradford later wrote, "several strangers made discontented and mutinous speeches. "The Pilgrims knew if something wasn't done quickly it could be every man, woman and family for themselves.

## The full text of the Mayflower Compact is as follows:

In the name of God, Amen. We, whose names are underwritten, the Loyal Subjects of our dread Sovereign

Lord King James, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, defender of the Faith, etc.:

Having undertaken, for the Glory of God, and advancements of the Christian faith, and the honor of our King and Country, a voyage to plant the first colony in the Northern parts of Virginia; do by these presents, solemnly and mutually, in the presence of God, and one another; covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic; for our better ordering, and preservation and furtherance of the ends aforesaid; and by virtue hereof to enact, constitute, and frame, such just and equal laws, ordinances, acts, constitutions, and offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the colony; unto which we promise all due submission and obedience.

In witness whereof we have hereunto subscribed our names at Cape Cod the 11th of November, in the year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord King James, of England, France, and Ireland, the eighteenth, and of Scotland the fifty-fourth, 1620.

After some 150 years, the 13 original colonies were firmly established, still under the Rule of The King of England, but the overreach of the "Government" became unbearable. England had become "occupiers" of the Colonies and took liberties on the colonists by denying their rights. They would occupy their homes without consent, confiscate food, firearms and personal property through illegal search and seizure, they taxed them unreasonably without representation or consent, They censored speech to the point of restricting what ministers could preach from the pulpit and silenced dissent in the public square. That and much more, as the colonists had become unrepresented subjects, forced to behave and conduct themselves according to the will of the King.

To make a long story short, As the first Americans, compliance with authoritarian rule was not in the colonist's DNA and as a result, they rebelled, declared their Independence and against overwhelming odds and against the most powerful military in the world, defeated England and became The United States of America.

In the nearly 250 years since, America established itself time and again as a beacon of Freedom and Hope across the globe. We as a people have made mistakes and continue to do so, but history also demonstrates that America is the most benevolent, fair, just and amazing country to ever exist. I believe that is in large part due to the fact that it was founded as a Free and Christian Nation. We have welcomed people from all walks of life, every race, creed and color, with open arms to pursue the American Dream of Freedom and the promise


